ANNOUNCEMENT OF INTENT TO FILL BOARD VACANCY AND APPLICATION INFORMATION

Applicants must be 18 years of age or older, and reside within North Cow Creek Elementary School District and be a registered voter. The application process includes the Candidate Information Sheet, a brief resume of the applicant's background, and a statement explaining why the applicant is interested in becoming a member of the North Cow Creek Elementary School District Board of Trustees. Applicants may be interviewed on Tuesday, February 25 at the regularly scheduled Board Meeting at 7:00 pm or by a subcommittee of the Board of Trustees during the first week of March. More information will be distributed to applicants after February 14th.
